THE COUNTRY PANTRY is in need of **PINEAPPLE** and **APPLESAUCE**. Also, please note that loose change collected in worship on the third Sunday of each month is given the Country Pantry.

ALSO, The Country Pantry is preparing for the traditional **summer kids Paks** give away during June, July and August. With summer vacation, the children qualifying for school meals need extra kid preferred food items.

Each month the pantry serves around 200 - 250 children. If the pantry had to buy these items it would cost around \$3000.00 per month. Therefore, the community is asked to help provide the following items:

granola bars, cereal, fruit cups, pudding cups, canned soup, ramen noodles, coloring books, story books and crayons.

The items may be dropped off at church or directly to the pantry. They can also leave it in the gazebo on April 27th.


